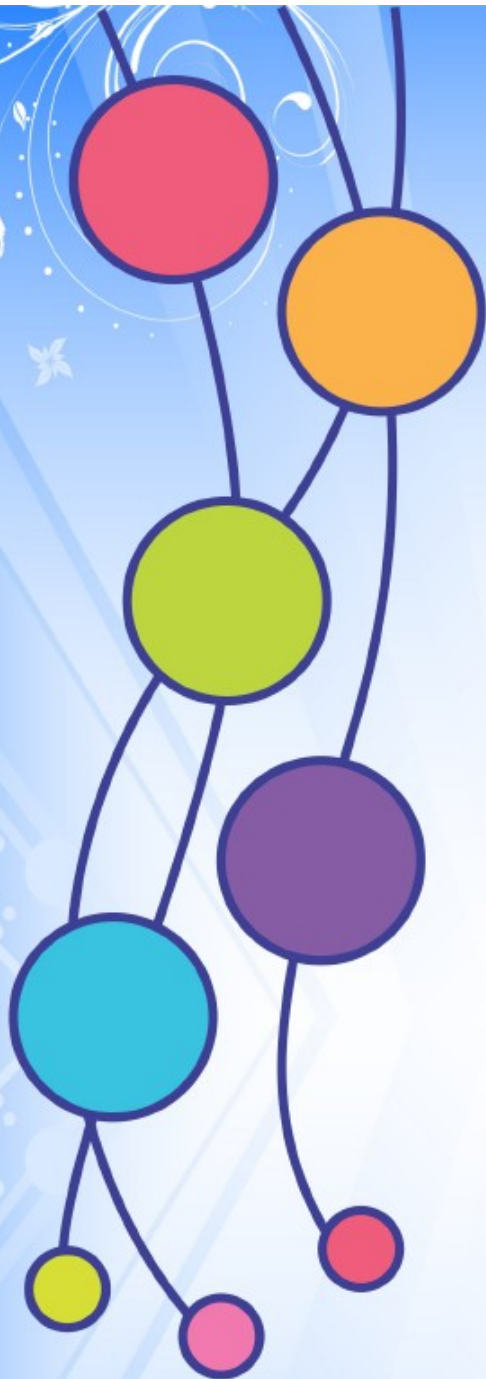

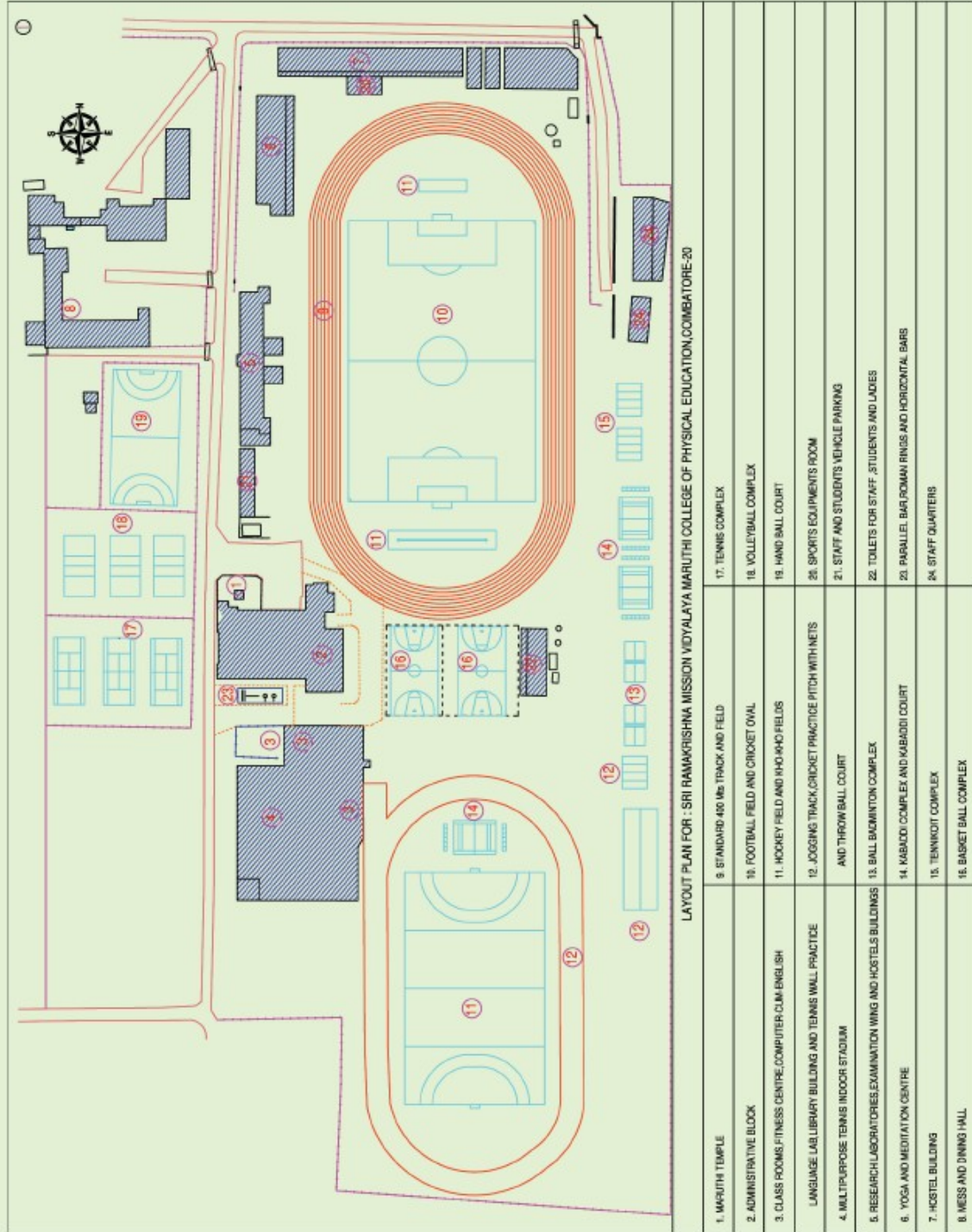

Play Festival

The Play Festival was started in the year 1956, to commemorate the centenary of Bhagavan Sri Ramakrishna. About 3000 children from 50 schools participate in the play festival in which they perform various types of exercises to the tune of devotional and patriotic songs. Every year around 2500 children from various Panchayat Union Elementary Schools of Perianaickenpalayam and Karamadal will participate in the demonstration of physical and play activities.

Attendance: Minimum of 80 percent attendance in theory and practical class each year is compulsory.

Medium of Instruction: The medium of instruction will be English & Tamil.

Course of Study: The total working days shall not be less than 200 working days in an academic year (Each Semester consists of not less than 100 working days excluding examination days). Each working day shall consist of 4 hours of Practical Work (Morning and Evening 2 hours each session) and 3 hours of theory in between.

Adapted Physical Education: One paper on adapted physical education is included as core paper for PG students. The paper carries 100 marks and minimum score of 50% is compulsory for a pass.

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Students should be medically fit and free from any deformities and they undergo medical examination at the time of admission.

Eligibility Criteria

For MPhil: Candidates who have passed post-graduate degree in physical education (MPEd., MPE.,) of any University accepted by the syndicate of Tamilnadu Physical Education and Sports University with not less than 50% marks are eligible to apply for admission to M.Phil Course.

For MPEd: A candidate for admission to the Master of Physical Education (MPEd) degree programme should have passed BPE (or) BPEd examination from any recognised university. They must have represented district/college/university/state in any one of the games or sports. He must be medically fit and free from physical deformities. Students will undergo medical examination at the time of admission. Candidates who have obtained at least 50% marks in the BPEd degree / BPEd (Integrated) 4 years professional degree are eligible for admission. The reservation for SC / ST / OBC and other categories shall be as per the rules of the Central Government / State Government, whichever is applicable. There shall be relaxation of 5% marks in favour of SC / ST / OBC and other categories of candidates.

For BPEd: A candidate shall be eligible for admission to the Bachelor of Physical Education (BPEd) if he has taken a degree of a recognized university subject to the following conditions. He must have represented the college / university / district / state in anyone of the games or athletics (as included in the inter-university competitions). Graduates in Physical Education with 40% marks.

Or
Graduate with Physical education as an elective subject with 40% marks.

Or
Graduate having participated in National / State / Inter-University sports / games / athletics I SGFI

Or
Any Graduate who participated School, Inter collegiate in Sports / Games OR passed NCC 'C' Certificate.

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OTHER INSTITUTIONS OF THE VIDYALAYA

The Vidyalaya had a humble beginning as a school with a single student in 1930. The foundation stone was laid by Mahatma Gandhi on 7 February 1934, and the institution was affiliated to the Ramakrishna Mission in January 1935.

The selflessness and dedication of the founder, Dr. T. S. Avinashilingam, and some devoted teachers promoted this simple school in various ways. Today this major educational complex sprawls over an acres of nearly 300 acres, rendering service in the field of education from preschool to postgraduate and doctorate levels.

As envisaged by Swami Vivekananda, the institution in this campus strive hard to impart man making and character building education to the youth, and try to inculcate in them self - reliance, self control, selflessness and such allied qualities that go to develop character.

The institutions attempt to offer educational programmes at different levels in tune with this vision of Swami Vivekananda. The profile below gives the activities of the Vidyalaya.

A PROFILE OF INSTITUTIONS OF THE VIDYALAYA

T.A.T. Kalanilayam Middle School

The T.A.T. Kalanilayam Middle School was started in the year 1940. Students are admitted at all levels from I std to VIII std. Rural and poor children from the surrounding areas of the Vidyalaya receive education here.

Vidyalaya High School

This institution is the first to be founded in the Vidyalaya campus. A few physically challenged students are also admitted in the school along with other students under the Integrated Education Programme. This residential school offers education from VI std to X std. Students in this school receive the ancient 'gurukula' kind of education.

Or

For Deputed / in service candidates (trained Physical Education teachers/coaches) Graduate with 40% marks.

The reservation for SC / ST / OBC and other categories shall be as per the rules of the Central Government / State Government, whichever is applicable. There shall be relaxation of 5% marks in favour of SC / ST / OBC and other categories of candidates.

Leadership Training Camp

Every year our college is conducting the Leadership Training Camp at Poondi. Every student shall undergo a 7 days Residential Annual Leadership Training Camp in an evergreen forest as an educational project.

Coaching Programme

Rural Coaching Programme is in progress during every year for our MPED I & II year students at the month of October for various Government and Matriculation schools in Coimbatore district.

Practice Teaching: Undergoing Intensive Practice Teaching in neighboring schools is compulsory for all the students (100 marks)

Project Sports Meet: Every year students are provided academic credits for successful execution of project sports meet. A group of students shall be given the responsibility of organising and officiating a sports meet and tournament in the institution.

Play Festival: Each student must go to train elementary school students in various play activities for a period of 19 days and assist his trainees for a combined mass drill at the college campus (100 marks compulsory activity)

Ragging: Ragging is an unpardonable injustice against students community and students who indulge in this barbarian act will definitely be expelled from the institution and also punishable by law (vide GO MS No 469 ES & T / dated 24.04.1989 and DTE Lr No 109717/13/88 dated 22.09.1989.)

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Swami Shivananda Higher Secondary School

This school was started in 1960 in the name of Sri Ramakrishna's direct disciple Swami Shivananda. This school has both English and Tamil mediums. Industrial training Institute (ITI)

This institute was founded in the year 1951 and is affiliated to the National Council for Vocational Training (NCVT), Government of India, New Delhi. The institute has been awarded the ISO 9001:2000 Certificate. The institute offers trades of two-year duration in Fitter, Turner, Machinist, Draughtsman(Mechanical), Draughtsman(Civil), Wireman, Electrician, Electronic Mechanic, Mechanic Motor Vehicle, Mechanic Computer Hardware and a trade of one year duration in Welder (gas and electric).

Institute of Agriculture and Rural Development (IARD)

This institution, started in 1956, offers a two year course leading to a Diploma in Agriculture with special agricultural training programmes to enlighten and uplift the rural masses.

Gandhi Teacher Training Institute (GTII)

The Gandhi Teacher Training Institute, established in 1942, offers a two year Diploma Course in Teacher Education emphasizing the role and responsibility of a teacher in society.

Polytechnic College

In the year 1956, our college had its inception as School of Engineering under the Rural Institute that had two other wings, viz., School of Agriculture and School of Higher Education. In 1978, the School of Engineering was brought under the control of the Director of Technical Education and the name was changed to Sri Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya Polytechnic College. The Tamil Nadu Government accorded autonomous status to our Polytechnic in 1980-81. The college has made remarkable achievements over the years and is now a certified ISO 9001:2008 institute.

College of Education

The college offers B.Ed programme with methodologies in Biological Science, Commerce, Mathematics, History, Physical Science and Special English and M.Ed. Part time M.Phil and Ph.D courses are offered. This college also houses the Indira Gandhi National Open University's study centre which offers B.Ed, M.Ed and M.A Educational programmes.

Apart from the formal courses, the college offers application - oriented diploma courses such as Computer Awareness, Educational Applications of Television, Library and Information System, Educational Psychology and Child Education. Besides these, certificate courses in Spoken English and Yoga are also offered.

College of Arts and Science

The College was started in 1964 and has completed 45 years of purposeful service to the society. This college including the Self financing wing.

Faculty of General & Adapted Physical Education and Yoga (GAPEY)

This Faculty was started in the year 2007 with the aims to train the future teacher to integrate sports and games meant for the special children (disabled and challenged) with the mainstream physical training. It conducts courses at various levels and attempts to emphasize on Yoga and General Health.

Faculty of Disability Management and Special Education (FDMSE)

Making of the University: The ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India, as per its notification dated 5 January 2005, based on the recommendation of the University Grants Commission, accorded a University - status to our International Human Resource Development Centre for the Disabled in the Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya. Coimbatore, naming it as the Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda Educational and research Institute. Now, following a communication from the UGC, the name of the

University is Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda University (RKMVU), having its Headquarters at Ramakrishna Mission, Belur Math, Howrah, West Bengal and its Faculty of Disability Management and Special Education (FDMSE) in the Vidyalaya. At long last, the vision of Swami Vivekananda has become a reality.

CELEBRATIONS AT VIDYALAYA

The Kalpataru Day: The day on which Sri Ramakrishna revealed his true identity and blessed his followers is celebrated on the 1st of January every year as the Kalpataru Day.

The Gurupuja: The public celebration of Sri Ramakrishna's birthday is celebrated on the 1st Sunday of January every year with devotion and fervour. Thousands of devotees attend this function and receive the blessings of the Gurudev. They listen to devotional songs and watch cultural programmes performed by the students of the Vidyalaya. Students of the Vidyalaya exhibit their scientific talents by presenting their models and invention in Science. Eminent speakers enlighten the audience their devotional fervour.

The National Youth Day: As declared by the Government of India, the birthday of Swami Vivekananda, is celebrated during 12th January every year. More than 1500 students including 100 staff members involve in this celebration. A youth rally is conducted with Swamiji's sayings and pictures as mobile exhibitions. Sports competitions, oratorical competition and essay writing competition are held.

World Disability Day: The Third Day of December every year is observed as the World Day for the Disabled all over the world. This day provides an opportunity to focus the attention of Government and the society towards the problems of the handicapped community. The handicapped draw inspiration to integrate themselves into the mainstream of social life. This occasion gives an opportunity to the community to express its solidarity with the disabled people.

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Birthday Celebration: The birthday of Sri Ramakrishna, Sri Sarada Devi, and Swami Vivekananda are celebrated with special puja, homa, bhajans and arati at the Vidyalaya's Prayer Hall.

Vidyarthi Homa: The Vidyarthi Homa is the induction of youth into the life of a student. This is performed with a homa, accompanied by mantras and bhajans reflecting the traditional values of the ancient gurukula. The newly admitted students from all the institutions of the Vidyalaya participate in the Vidyarthi Homa. Each student receives guidance regarding his conduct in student life.

Saraswathi Puja: The Saraswathi Puja is solemnly celebrated in all institutions, hostels and other departments of the Vidyalaya. Entire staff and students participate in the puja.

Kalaimagal Vizha: Kalaimagal Vizha, the annual three day event in commemoration of the Navaratri, is celebrated in the Vidyalaya during the month of October. Eminent speakers and performing artistes are invited on the occasion. Students from various institutions of the Vidyalaya give inspiring drama and dance performances.

Graduation Ceremony: The Graduation Ceremonies are conducted for the graduating students from the Post – Matric Institutions and Colleges of the Vidyalaya to administer oath taking and bid farewell with the counsel to function as diligent citizens in their walks of life. Dignitaries from different sectors of society embellish this occasion.

Republic Day and Independence Day Celebration: The Republic Day and Independence Day are Celebrated on 26th January and 15th August respectively every year in a grand scale with march past, flag hoisting and special address where all the institutions participate together. A rolling trophy for the best marching contingent is awarded.

Vidyalaya Foundation Day: Vidyalaya Foundation Day is observed every year on 3rd February. As a mark of respect to the founder of the Vidyalaya, Dr. TS Avinashilingam, public meeting are conducted on that day and eminent persons visit the Vidyalaya to address.

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Spiritual Retreat: Spiritual Retreats are conducted for the devotees every year. Hundreds of devotees from various parts of the nation attend the retreats. Retreats are also conducted for the members of the staff of the Vidyalaya.

EXAMINATIONS / RULES AND REGULATIONS

Continuous Assessment

1. Internal evaluation is done based on the performance of the students in their continuous assessment / model exam, assignments etc.
2. All students must compulsorily appear for atleast one continuous assessment / Model Examination. Retest shall be allowed only for those students who absented themselves after obtaining prior permission.
3. If students are caught indulging in malpractice during Continuous Internal Assessment / Model Exams, the Malpractice Committee may award punishment up to the suspension of the delinquent student for one week.

Examinations

1. No student shall be allowed to appear for Practical Examinations without Record Note and such students shall be considered as absent.
2. Students shall be considered to have appeared for that particular examination only if they appear for all the components stipulated for such Examinations.
3. Leave on medical grounds will be granted only on production of a medical certificate from qualified medical practitioner. Such students, however, shall be treated as absent.
4. Students having arrears in any subject shall be allowed to appear for the examinations in the subsequent semesters in the same scheme for a maximum of three years from the year of admission for regular students. Thereafter, the students having arrears shall have to appear for the equivalent papers, if available in the scheme in force. In case of students discontinued/ debarred from appearing for the semester examinations for want of attendance or any other reason, shall have to join the classes under the scheme in force.

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SEMESTER EXAMINATIONS

Requirements to appear for Semester Examinations:

Conduct of Examination - General: The Examinations will be conducted at the end of each semester by the office of the Deputy Controller of Examinations. The schedule of examination will be displayed in the notice board well in advance. The candidates are well informed of the details regarding payment of examination fees, last dates, examination time table etc. for all semesters. Even though the medium of instruction of all courses (B.P.Ed) is English the candidates are being permitted to answer in Tamil also. The student must compulsorily bring their hall tickets and identify cards. If the candidate has forgotten to bring the hall ticket to the hall on the examination day, he must apply for temporary hall ticket. External staffs are being appointed as Hall Superintendents for the effective supervision of the examinations. Students booked for involvement in malpractice (Refer Annexure -II) in any examination (theory/ practical) will be required by an Enquiry Committee headed by the Chief Superintendent of the examination center. The candidates shall be given a fair chance to defend themselves during the enquiry conducted at the institution on the same day. The punishments will be awarded by the Awards Committee constituted depending on the nature and severity of the malpractice. An Awards Committee meeting is being conducted to approve the results. The results of the examinations are being published in the notice board. The individual mark sheets will be printed and handed over within 15 days from the date of publication of results.

Reasons for disqualifying a student from appearing Examination:

1. Failure to acquire the minimum required percentage of attendance during a semester/ individual subject. Such candidates, however, will be permitted to write the supplementary examinations of previous semesters, if any.
2. Found indulging in malpractice in the previous examinations and debarred henceforth.

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7. Exchanging with neighbours hall tickets, question papers, scales, calculator, instrument box etc. with any formula, answers, sketches, hints related to the day's examination written on them.
8. Showing the answer book/ additional sheet to the neighbours or allowing them to copy.
9. Giving/ Getting the main answer book or additional sheet to/ from neighbour for copying.
10. Writing the examination even after the final bell, not obeying the hall superintendent's instructions.
11. Telling the answer or formula related to any of the question to others.
12. Inserting pre-written additional sheet(s) having matters related to the subject of the day's examination into the main answer book.
13. Replacing the answer book supplied in the hall by pre-prepared answer book brought by the candidate himself or got from outsiders.
14. Refusing to give written statement, refusing to receive show cause notice, absentsing from enquiries, running away from examination hall when caught for any malpractice, trying to destroy the evidences by tearing/ swallowing/ erasing/ throwing away the bits, materials etc.
15. Writing filthy/ indecent/ vulgar words or sketching obscene figures etc in the answer book or additional sheets attached.
16. Bribing or attempting to bribe the Hall Superintendent/ Additional or Chief Superintendent
17. Distracting the Hall Superintendent or fellow students for sake of copying etc.
18. Taking away with him the written answer book, without handing over the same to the Hall superintendent.
19. Violating any special rules/ regulations prescribed then and there by the College.
20. Impersonation- Arranging some other person to write the examination for the candidate (or) attempting to write the examination for somebody else.

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3. Got expelled/ discontinued from the college.
 4. When suspension period overlaps with the examination schedules.
 5. Non-payment of fees in time.
 6. After the lapse of maximum permitted time limit, unless otherwise notified.
- Acts of Malpractice in Examinations:** A candidate indulging in any of the following acts in the examination hall will be considered as committed malpractice in the examination and booked for the same:
1. Possession of printed / photocopy / written materials pertaining / not pertaining to the day's examination, or pertaining to the examination already appeared by the candidate in the form of book or loose sheets that have been either made use of or not made use of in the examination.
 2. Possession of programmable calculators, mobile phones, pagers, organizers, digital memory pad etc, with/ without matters related to the day's examination stored in them and made use of them or not in the examination.
 3. Writing any matter, formula, definitions, sketches, pertaining/ not pertaining to the day's examination, in any part of the candidate's body, dress, instrument box, calculator cover, wall, table, drawing board, question paper, hall ticket etc, and made use of them or not in the examination.
 4. Keeping with them, tables, hand book, code books etc which are not permitted for the day's examination and made/ not made use of them in the examination.
 5. Talking with neighbours, showing or receiving signs or signals to others in the hall/ verandah.
 6. Copying from printed/ Xerox/ handwritten bits/ sheets/ book / programmable calculators, organizers, digital memory pad etc. in the examination

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HOSTEL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Students will be allowed to stay only for that academic year.
2. Students who are willing to discontinue from the hostel has to pay the full fees.
3. 1st instalment fees have to be paid at the time of admission itself.
4. Social service is essential thing in the hostel life. Students have to keep their rooms and surroundings clean. For this, duty will be allotted on the basis of rotation.
5. For students those who go out of the campus without the permission of warden the management of college and hostel will not be responsible if at all anything happened
6. Students should not keep any costly items as well as excess money with them, else they are responsible for any loss.
7. Students should keep their cupboards safely, else recovery will be made for the repair work.
8. Cell phone and radio are strictly prohibited within the campus. If any one violate this they have to abide the disciplinary action taken by the management.
9. Students who involve in the activities which is against the name and fame of the college as well hostel will be dismissed from the college.
10. Students have to attend evening prayer without fail.
11. Students who want to go to their native place for holidays have to get prior permission from the warden
12. Students should not bring any outsiders to the hostel.
13. With regard to problems related to students, final decision will be made by the management other students will not interfere in this regard.

21. Assaulting physically or attempting to attack any examination staff while being caught/ booked for any malpractice
22. Causing damage to examination records.

23. Arranging outside persons to terrorize the examination staff
24. Leaving the examination hall with the question paper of the day's examination before the expiry of the period prescribed (normally 30 minutes from the commencement of exam), in spite of the warning of Hall Superintendent/ Additional (or) Chief Superintendent)

Punishments for Malpractice: The following may be the punishments awarded to students found indulging in malpractice as decided by the Awards Committee:

1. All papers of the concerned semester written, by the candidate in that sitting along with supplementary papers, will be cancelled
2. And till then the institution shall not be issued Transfer Certificate or Course Completion Certificate to such candidates.

Classification of successful candidates: Classification of candidates who pass out final examination is being done as specified below:

Passing Minimum: A candidate will be declared to have passed if he secures not less than 50% and above of the aggregate marks in all theory & practical.

First class with Distinctions: A candidate will be declared to have passed in First class with Distinction, if he secures not less than 75% and above of the aggregate marks in all Semesters put together.

First class: A candidate will be declared to have passed in First Class, if he secures not less than 60% to 74.99% of the aggregate marks in all semesters put together.

Second Class: All other successful candidates will be declared to have passed in Second class.

- 2. **M.Phil Degree (Master of Philosophy)** The college offers M.Phil. degree on a full-time basis both men and women are eligible for admission to the course

COMMON GUIDELINES FOR M.P.Ed. AND B.P.Ed.

GRADING SYSTEM: To pass in an examination a student has to score a minimum of 50% marks in each paper - Theory, Practice Teaching and Practical (Internal and External separately).

50%	-	Minimum Pass Marks
51% to 59%	-	Second Class
60% to 74%	-	First Class
75% and above	-	Distinction (in first attempt)

ATTENDANCE: Minimum of 80 per cent attendance in theory and practical class each year.

MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION: The medium of instruction will be English.

COURSE OF STUDY: The total working days shall not be less than 200 working days in an academic year (Each Semester consists of not less than 100 working days) excluding examination days. Each working day shall consist of 4 hours of Practical Work (Morning and Evening 2 hours each session) and 3 hours of theory in between.

VALUE EDUCATION: One paper on value education is a special feature of our College. The paper carries 100 marks and minimum score of 50% is compulsory for a pass.

ADAPTED PHYSICAL EDUCATION: One paper on adapted physical education preferably related to covering sports specialisation is mandatory for all students. The paper carries 100 marks and minimum score of 50% is compulsory for a pass.

MASTER OF PHYSICAL EDUCATION (M.P.Ed.)

ELIGIBILITY: Candidates who have obtained at least 50% marks in the B.P.Ed. degree/B.P.Ed. (Integrated) 4 years professional degree are eligible for admission.

The reservation for SC/ST/OBC and other categories shall be as per the rules of the Central Government / State Government, whichever is applicable. There shall be relaxation of 5% marks in favour of SC/ST/OBC and other categories of candidates. He must be medically fit and free from physical deformities. Students will undergo medical examination at the time of admission.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE:

DURATION: The duration of the program shall be two academic years with four semesters under the Choice Based Credit System. The semesters shall be from July to November and December to April for each academic year.

RESEARCH PROJECT: The students must compulsorily submit a minor research project at the end of fourth semester (100 marks).

RURAL COACHING: The M.P.Ed. students have to conduct coaching at rural schools / colleges and organise a tournament for them.

BACHELOR OF PHYSICAL EDUCATION (B.P.Ed.)

ELIGIBILITY: Any Graduate who participated School, Inter-collegiate in Sports / Games: Graduates in Physical Education with 40% marks OR Graduate with Physical Education as an elective subject with 40% marks. OR Graduate having participated in National / State / Inter-university sports / games / athletics / SGFI. OR Passed NCC 'C' Certificate. OR For Deputed / in service candidates (trained Physical Education teachers / coaches) Graduate with 40% marks. The reservation for SC / ST / OBC and other categories shall be as per the rules of the Central Government / State Government, whichever is applicable. There shall be relaxation of 5% marks in favour of SC / ST / OBC and other categories of candidates.

REGISTRATION OF APPLICATION

Application for admission should be made in the prescribed form obtained from the college. The form should be neatly filled in and sent to the Principal, Sri Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya Maruthi College of Physical Education, Sri Ramakrishna Vidyalaya Post, Coimbatore - 641 020.

Photocopies of all the required certificates should be enclosed. Please do not send originals with the application form. Selected students will be informed well in advance to report to the college with all the certificates in ORIGINALS along with FEE. If the candidate fails to report in time, his admission will be cancelled and given to the candidates in the waiting list.

SCHOLARSHIPS





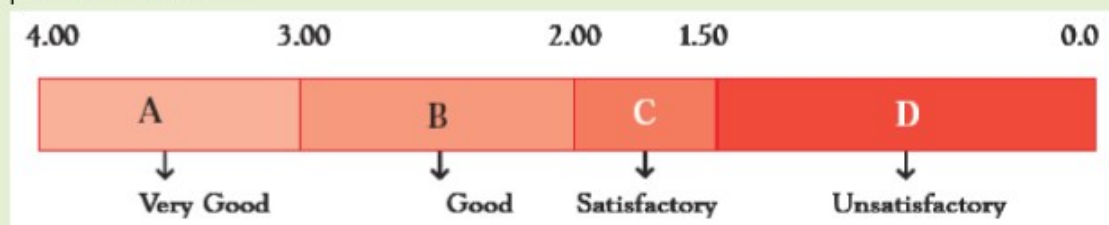

i. A brief note on physical education scenario in the state, rules, regulations and policies on academic and administrative governance issued by the state and central government/regulatory bodies and affiliating university/board:

Literally the land of Tamils is one of the 29 states of India. Its capital is Chennai (formerly known as Madras), the largest city. Tamil Nadu lies in the southernmost part of the Indian Peninsula and is bordered by the union territory of Puducherry and the states of Kerala, Karnataka, and Andhra Pradesh. It is bounded by the Eastern Ghats on the north, by the Nilgiri, the Anamalai Hills, and Kerala on the west, by the Bay of Bengal in the east, by the Gulf of Mannar and the Palk Strait on the southeast, and by the Indian Ocean on the south. Tamil Nadu is the eleventh largest state in India by area and the seventh most populous state in India. The state is ranked 6th among states in India according to the Human Development Index as of 2011. It is the second largest state in economy in India as of 2012. Its official language is Tamil, which holds a status of being a classical language. Tamil has been in use in inscriptions and literature for over 2500 years. Tamil Nadu is home to many natural resources, classical arts, classical music, classical literature, Hindu temples of Dravidian architecture, hill stations, beach resorts, multi-religious pilgrimage sites, and eight UNESCO World Heritage Sites.

To promote excellence in physical education and sports, Tamil Nadu Physical Education and Sports University has been established by an Act of the Government of Tamil Nadu in 2004, is unique and the first of its kind in India as an affiliatory University, exclusively for Physical Education and Sports. After obtaining the consent from his Excellency the president of India on 5th August 2005, the said act came into force with effect from 15th September 2005. It is a rare coincidence that the University was started functioning from December 2005, declared by the United Nations as International year for Sport and Physical Education. At present the University has three Faculties, five Departments and ten affiliated Colleges. Further the University now offers Physical Education and Allied Courses, through collaborative programme and Distance Education stream also.

The affiliated colleges of Tamil Nadu Physical Education and Sports University offer courses like Diploma in physical education (DPed), Bachelor of physical education (B.P.Ed.), Master of physical education (M.P.Ed.), Master of Philosophy (MPhil) and Doctor of Philosophy (PhD). Apart from these physical education colleges which are affiliated to Tamil Nadu Physical Education and Sports University, other universities like Bharathiar university, Annamalai university, Alagappa university, Manonmaniam Sundaranar university, Madurai Kamaraj university and Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda university offer the above courses through department of physical education.

As far as physical education teacher training courses are concerned, the following norms and standards of National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE) are followed:

These courses are conducted for a period of 200 working days in a year excluding examination and admission. The students and staff ratio is as per NCTE guidelines for example, for 100 B.P.Ed. students, there should be 1 principal and 8 assistant professors which leads to 1:12 ratio.

Director of Collegiate Education, Tamilnadu has passed a G.O with regard to admission gudilines for physical education colleges. As per the guidelines the admission for the above courses are followed by the affiliated colleges of Tamil Nadu Physical Education and Sports University by conducting an entrance test for 150 marks by a suitable selection committee constituted as per the guidelines. The rule of reservation in admission is also applied. Among the affiliated colleges, Maruthi college of physical education and YMCA college of physical education are having autonomous status. The syllabus and scheme of examination are prepared by Board of studies constituted as per UGC norms which is approved by Academic council and Governing body.

In Tamilnadu a number of colleges are offering 3 years UG degree namely, BSc in physical education which is considered as a basic degree, and also some of the physical education colleges offer a 3 years Bachelor of Physical Education (BPE) degree course. The autonomous colleges have well equipped laboratories and have been recognized as the "Research Centres" by Tamil Nadu Physical Education and Sports University. Through the research centres, these colleges conduct research programmes like MPhil and PhD and minor and major research projects from UGC. The autonomous colleges receive UG and PG grants from UGC for the development of library, laboratories, infrastructure and students support services like UGC NET coaching classes etc.

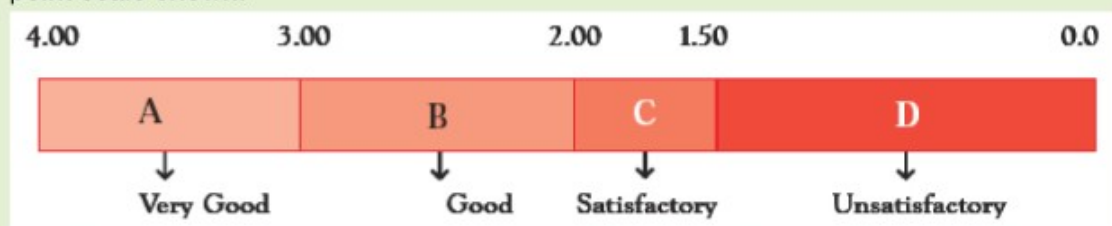





6. Best Practices of our institution

Best Practice - I

Man Making and Character Building Education

Introduction

Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya was established on the ideals of Swami Vivekananda. In our Maruthi College of Physical Education, the entire educational process revolves around the man making and character building education. According to Swami Vivekananda, "the end of all education, all training should be man making. The end and aim of all training is to make the man grow. What our country now wants are muscles of iron and nerves of steel, gigantic wills which nothing can resist, it is man-making education all round that we want". Swamiji further emphasizes that, "we want education by which character is formed, strength of mind is increased, the intellect is expanded and by which one can stand on one's own feet. What we need is to study, independent of foreign control, different branches of the knowledge that is our own, and with it the english language and western science; we need technical education and all else that will develop industries, so that men instead of seeking for service may earn enough by independent self-employment to provide for themselves".

How to establish good character:

Swami Vivekananda considered that formation of good character is the essence of education and explained how it can be formed. "The character of any man is but the aggregate of his tendencies, the sum total of the bent of his mind. As pleasure and pain pass before his soul, they leave upon it different pictures, and the result of these combined impressions is what is called a man's character. We are what our thoughts have made us. Each thought is a little hammer blow on the lump of iron which our bodies are, manufacturing out of it what we want it to be. Words are secondary. Thoughts live; they travel far; and so take care of what you think. If a man thinks good thoughts and does good work, the sum total of these impressions will be good and they in a similar manner will force him to do good in spite of himself. When a man has done so much good work and has so many good thoughts, there is an irresistible tendency in him to do good. Even if he wishes to do evil, his mind as the sum total of his tendencies will not allow him to do. He is completely under the influence of the good tendencies. When such is the case, a man's good character is said to be established."

Personality development:

"Personality is thus something beyond the body. It is a combination of many qualities. Strength, courage, firmness, ability to inspire people are some of the qualities common to men and women of outstanding personality. Personality is the sum total of all biological and acquired dispositions, impulses, tendencies and instincts of the individual. It is the total quality of an individual's behavior, as it revealed in his habits, thoughts and expressions, attitudes and interests, his manner of functioning and his personal philosophy of life."

Objectives of the Practice

1. To prepare the Physical Education teachers with outstanding leadership qualities.
2. "Service to mankind is the service to God" is the motto of Ramakrishna Mission hence; emphasis is given to serve the society.
3. "Work is worship" no work in the Vidyalaya is considered as low and high and all the students are have been made to understand this principle through various activities.
4. Value education is being given top priority in our campus which gives wisdom to our students, to have discriminating ability, to understand which is right, which is wrong and which is to be followed.
5. The education in our Vidyalaya campus is not only meant for giving training for the required skills but also to prepare them to live the life with moral and ethical values.

The Practice

The annual calendar is planned well in advance by allotting suitable schedule for theory and practical activities to prepare a good physical education teacher. Planning has been put forth in designing the various activities for our students to develop leadership qualities among them. The activities include leadership training camp, project sports meet, intramural activities, practice teaching, external tournaments, rural coaching, play festival; participating in cultural programmes, our staff and students serve the society through the various extension activities, which include organizing sports and games to various institutions, officiating and laying play fields, etc.,

Our institution conducts many programmes which help the community. These activities include serving in the slum areas like Arivoli Nagar and Bharathi Nagar, involving in the tree plantation and watering activities, blood donation, serving as the volunteers in the charitable hospital run by the Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya etc. These activities create a sense of responsibility among the students towards the society.

In the vidyalaya campus 'work culture' is practiced by the Swamiji's, heads of the institutions and staff members. Hence it is very easy to make the students to understand the value and importance of work culture. This includes self serving in the hostel mess, cleaning the hostel rooms, maintaining the play fields etc., Only a good follower could become a good leader, with this principle all the students are provided with ample opportunities to volunteer themselves in various activities throughout the year which make them as good leaders.

The core principle of our institution is to incorporate value education to the students. Many activities have been planned to imbibe moral and ethical and patriotism to the students. The activities include Gurupuja, Independence day, Republic day, National Youth day, Youth convention, special lectures by Swamiji's, spiritual retreat, Vidyarthi homa etc.

Obstacles Faced and Strategies Adopted

- a) Hesitation to take up the activities: Initially students would hesitate to take part in the social activities like serving in the slum areas and cleaning the play fields etc. But through the lectures all the staff members motivate the students to understand the

importance of serving the poor people. Moreover, we have included the maintenance of play fields in our curriculum.

- b) Irregular and not punctual: When the students are irregular and not punctual in attending the classes, all the staff members are involved in correcting the students through their exemplary work culture. Our staff members are very punctual for all the sessions and activities which make the students to follow.
- c) Ignorance of ethical, moral and spiritual activities: In our campus, we have many Swamiji's and monks who would be addressing the students on various occasions, which takes away the ignorance of the students on the issues of ethical, moral and spirituality.
- d) Inhibition and low self confidence: Our college curriculum and the entire environment of the Vidyalaya make the students to involve in various social activities, cultural activities and sports events which would take away their inhibition and make them more confident.

Impact of the Practice

Students would join our college from various backgrounds but mainly from the rural and also from the economically weaker sections. They do not have exposure to the various activities which would contribute to their overall personality development.

But with the exposure to the multifaceted activities of the Vidyalaya in general and particularly man making and character building education which is imparted in our Maruthi College of Physical Education making huge impact on the personality development of our students.

Some of the prominent behavioral changes among the students

- ◆ Maintenance of punctuality
- ◆ Dignity of labour
- ◆ Positive attitude
- ◆ Sense of responsibility
- ◆ Sincerity to the work

Result:

Over a period of time, the educational institutions, which are recruiting the teaching staff, understood the difference in the attitude of the students of Maruthi College of Physical Education and the students of other institutions and are giving top priority to our college which conducting the campus interviews.

Our students are in great demand for the job opportunities; hence for the past two years 100% placement is taking place. Some of the students are getting more than two job opportunities.

Conclusion:

The vision of our college is "to provide personal, intellectual and professional growth of its students and staff and to produce an ideal physical education teacher with emphasis on

man making and character building education". Hence the entire programme, planning and execution of our college activities are directed only towards the man making and character building education.

Best Practice - II

Adapted Games and Rehabilitation Programme for Persons with Disability

Introduction

An estimated 10% of the world's population experiences some form of disability or impairment (WHO Action Plan 2006-2011). According to the India Census 2001: 2.19 crore people with disabilities live in India (2.13%). This includes persons with visual, hearing, speech, locomotor and mental disabilities. People with disability have more often sedentary lifestyles than people in general. A sedentary lifestyle that results from inadequate levels of physical fitness can contribute to a number of health problems, including obesity, hypertension, low back pain, osteoporosis, coronary heart disease, diabetes, colon cancer, anxiety and depression, and premature mortality. Regular physical activity is not prevalent in the lives of persons with disabilities. Physical fitness and regular physical activity are key factors in health and well being of all individuals.

In the current world the fitness and nutritional status among the population has become a big threat. By this the rate of birth of special children is alarmingly increasing. Our college is extending helping hand to this problem, and also stepped into innovations in this field to be a trend setter. As a first step we screened the regional population and as per their need rehabilitation and therapeutic services were provided only to children with intellectual disability in the year 2007. However, recently the scope of entire project has been extended to cover all the major disabilities.

Our college developed a sustainable curriculum in the field of Adapted Physical Education for creating awareness among the student-teachers of physical education. The pathway to achieving the theme, a group of concerned experts and therapists were gathered and designed rehabilitative and therapeutic welfare programmes for persons with disabilities through application of various therapies in numerous ways for the optimal development. The aim of the project was two fold. First was to concentrate on the academic progress and second one was to multidisciplinary rehabilitative approach to the parents and special children.

Objectives of the Practice

- a) It provides awareness among teacher trainees, special educators, curriculum developers and educational administrators, parents and others in service of disabled, particularly in teaching and training.
- b) It promotes research and publications in the area of adapted physical education.
- c) It improves the health-related physical fitness of the persons with disability.
- d) It organizes seminars inside the college premises.
- e) It joins hand with other nodal agencies to offer innovative programmes for persons with disability.
- f) It provides opportunities to get exposure to various therapies

- g) It provides inclusive welfare programmes to create social acceptance among the society

The Practice

The present practice came into existence by organizing national level bocce coaching and training camp for the intellectual disability in 2007. Consequently, various programmes were further designed in our college premises such as curriculum adaptation for the physical education course, encouraging research scholars, various disability sports in different categories, designing adapted games for persons with disabilities, designing adapted gadgets, rehabilitation set ups like physiotherapy, play therapy and prosthetic & orthotic unit etc.

Developing Adapted Physical Education Programmes

- ◆ Introduced Circle Kabaddi (Hearing Impaired), Maze Relay (Visually Impaired), Modified Kho-Kho (Visually Impaired), Ramp Bowling, Circle Bowler, T-stand Cricket, Wheelchair Hockey (Orthopeadically Disabled)
- ◆ Formulated adapted rules and regulations for the tournaments and officiating

Client Based Training Programmes

- ◆ Institution based programmes - adapted yoga, physical activities, therapeutic exercises and recreative games for the persons with disabilities
- ◆ Unified Play Day – Multidisciplinary training programme for the intellectually disabled children

Organizing Disability Sports Competitions

- ◆ National and state level Special Olympics and Paralympics Competitions
- ◆ Conducting adapted game tournaments and competitions at the District level

Research Work

- ◆ Enormous research works/projects and evaluation have been done in the area
- ◆ Our faculty members have also completed their PhD in the area of adapted physical education.

Obstacles Faced and Strategies Adopted

The financial assistance may prove to be burden but this is cheerfully overcome by various well-wishers. The management offers its share if the programme suffers for want of money.

Impact of the Practice

We strongly believe that an optimal development of a special child is achieved through application of various therapies in numerous ways. It will provide an interdisciplinary model and a platform to exchange from divergent fields to yield new and enhanced benefits. As a whole the college aims to provide programmes which creates an impact as well as awareness among the student teachers and the special population, to say, academic values and ethics, administration skills, social values, sports & games and problem solving.

The impacts are multi-fold and covers various aspects such as

- ◆ Inclusive recreational activities for persons with disabilities
- ◆ Based on the disability, the recreational and fitness activities were given by our students under the headship of Dr. S.Sukumari, Sports Physiotherapist.
- ◆ Seminars and Workshops for physical educators and special educators
- ◆ The students are given an opportunity to choose the adapted physical education as an elective subject at master's degree level.
- ◆ The differently abled are assisted in all their competitions by the college students particularly by those who have taken adapted physical education as an elective.
- ◆ Inter-school competitions are regular features at the campus for which our student volunteers to work with the organizers
- ◆ Special Olympics Programmes was organized at the campus under the leadership of Dr. M. S. Nagarajan, Sports Manager, Special Olympics Asia Pacific region.
- ◆ The college students are specially trained and are encouraged to work with differently abled children in evaluating the physical fitness levels of the special children and to offer physical fitness activities.

Resources Required

GLOSSARY

GLOSSARY

Academic bodies	- Various statutory bodies including Boards of Studies, Academic Council and Governing Body, etc which are responsible for academic decision-making.
Academic calendar	- The schedule of the institution for the academic year giving details like dates of reopening and closing, holidays, exams, results, convocation, celebrations & functions, etc.
Accreditation	- Certification of an academic institution with reference to quality provision that is valid for a fixed period. In the case of NAAC's accreditation, the period of validity is five years.
Achievement	- Accomplishment or proficiency of performance in a given scale or body of knowledge. Performance in school or college in a standardized series of educational tests. The term is used more generally to describe performance in the subjects of the curriculum.
Action Plan	- Action plan refer to specific actions that respond to short- and longer-term strategic objectives. Action plans include details of resource commitments and time limits for accomplishment.
Adapted Physical Education	- Adapted Physical Education is an individualised program of play and motor fitness, fundamental motor skills and patterns, aquatics and dance, individual and group games design to make the unique needs of individuals with disabilities.
Affiliated college	- A college which functions under the governance of a university which legislates on courses of study, holds examinations centrally on common syllabi and awards the degree.
Anatomy	- The internal structure of the body.
Assessment	- Performance evaluation of an institution or its unit.
Assignments	- Work produced by students and used by the teacher educators for the purposes of interaction and evaluation.
Athlete	- An individual, who demonstrates skill in a sport, trains and competes as part of her/his regular routine or career goal.

Audio – visual	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Specifically to describe all educational communication media and also use the senses of both sights (seeing) and sound (hearing) collectively or sometimes individually. These aids include Sound Films; Filmstrips; Tapes/slides, Broadcast television, Closed Circuit Television (CCTV), Video- Recording etc.
Autonomous colleges	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Colleges that have been conferred the special status with a provision to design their curriculum and conduct examinations within the broad frame work of the parent university. However, the degree awarding power is vested with the university. Overall they have limited academic, but no financial autonomy.
Best practices	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Programs, initiatives or activities which are considered leading edge, or exceptional models for others to follow.- The adoption of work practices which when effectively linked together, can be expected to lead to sustainable world class outcomes in quality, student satisfaction, flexible timeliness, innovations and cost effectiveness.
Budget	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Budget is a quantitative statement and usually in financial terms it reflects the planned allocations and use of resources.
Career	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- An occupation undertaken for a significant period of a person's life and with opportunities for progress.
Co-curricular activities	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Activities which support the curriculum such as field trips, display of academic achievements etc.
Communication	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Keeping everyone in touch and promoting information within and around the institution. This involves upward, downward and horizontal communication.
Competent	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Having suitable or sufficient skill, knowledge and experience.
Consultancy	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Activity with or without remuneration for which the expertise and the specific knowledge base of the faculty become the major input.
Counseling	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- The provision of professional assistance and guidance in resolving personal or psychological problems.- Exhorting, assisting and guiding students individually or collectively for academic, career, personal and financial decision-making.

Course	- A course is a planned series of learning experiences in a particular range of subjects or skills, offered by an institution and undertaken by one or more learners.
Criterion	- A principle or standard by which something may be judged or decided.
Curricular design/model	- A curriculum is the way of selecting and organizing courses of study offered to learners on the basis of the educational policy of an agency; the pattern of organization may be called 'design'; the different ways in which the design is made manifest are 'models'. The UGC, for instance, organizes courses at the U.G level of study in terms of core, foundation and elective courses; there are also other models such as the cafeteria model popular in the West.
Curriculum transaction	- Actions carried out in order to implement a given curriculum.
Data	- Recorded observations, usually in numeric or textual form.
Deficit Budget	- Deficit Budget is that budget when current expenditure of the institution is in excess of the current income or revenues of the institution.
Diversity	- Differences among groups of people and individuals based on caste, socioeconomic status, gender, exceptionalities, language, religion, and geographical location.
Drop out	- A dropout is the pupil who leaves the institution before the completion of a given stage of education or leave at some intermediate or non-terminal point in a cycle of education.
Educational technology	- The development, application and evaluation of systems, techniques and aids to improve the process of learning.
Evaluation	- Evaluation is an important tool for ensuring accountability. Evaluation and impact assessment can be summative or formative. Summative processes are carried out to determine the effectiveness of an activity, whereas formative processes are carried out during the period of the activity for providing feedback into the program reformulation and effecting mid- course changes.

Excel	- Deriving from the word excellent, to do very well or be exceptionally good at or proficient in an activity.
Excellence	- Achieving standards above average, nationally set performance targets encourage performers to strive for excellence.
Expenditure	- Expenditure means the amount actually spent on a project, activity, program etc. by the institution during the year.
Expert	- A person who has special skill or knowledge; a person who is a specialist authority in some particular field.
Extension Activities	- The aspect of education which emphasises neighbourhood services. These are often integrated with curricula as extended opportunities intended to help, serve, reflect and learn.
Faculty development	- Various usually formal training or activities funded by the employer to enhance the attitudes, knowledge and skills of the current faculty/employees.
Feedback	- The information received by learners immediately after each of their responses during a sequence of programmed instruction which indicates the correctness of the response.
First Aid	- This is the treatment given by the first person to arrive on the scene of an accident. It is better if the first aider is properly trained.
Gender	- Which sex a person is, eg. male or female.
Goals	- A result, milestone or checkpoint in the future which will indicate significant progress towards the vision.
Health	- A state of complete physical, mental, and social well-being, and not only the absence of disease or infirmity.
Income	- Income means receipts of the institution during the financial year from all sources
Infrastructure	- Physical facilities like buildings, play fields, hostels etc., which help run an institutional programme.
Innovation	- The action or process of innovating. Innovation is crucial to the continuing success of any organization.
Inputs	- What is put in, taken in, or operated on by any process or system. There is little input from other members of the team.

Internet	- The Internet is a worldwide system of computer network—a network of networks in which users at any one computer can, if they have permission, get information from any other computer.
Internship	- Generally, the post-qualification under the supervision of school faculty; sometimes referred to as the pre-service school experience.
Interviews	- A research tool in which a researcher asks questions of participants; interviews are often audio- or video-taped for later transcription and analysis.
Leadership	- The action of leading a group of people or an organization, or the ability to do this. Different styles of leadership.
Learning resources	- Facilities like library, research laboratories, computer centre etc., that are essential resources for the learning experience.
Lesson plan	- An outline of the important points of a lesson arranged in the order in which they are to be presented to the learners by the teacher.
Life skills	- A generic term for the various enterprise skills and other process skills needed to cope effectively with the outside world.
Mission	- The term “mission” refers to the overall function of an organization.
Motor skills	- A skill that requires voluntary body and/or limb movement to achieve its goal. A skill where the primary determinant of success is the movement component itself. Physical activity directed toward a specific function or goal.
Network	- A general term for any system consisting of a number of physically separated but interconnected sub-systems, eg. computers, word processors, radio or television stations, agencies, institutions, organizations, etc.
Objective	- A desired outcome of an instructional process or programme expressed in highly-specific terms.
Peer feedback	- Feedback given by the other student – teachers after each practice teaching.
Performance Appraisal	- Performance Appraisal is systematic assessment of an individual’s performance in order to assess his training needs, potential for promotion, eligibility

	<p>for a merit increment as part of pay or salary review or for management succession planning. Methods of appraisal include the controlled report, factor rating, forced choice ranking system, task based appraisal etc.</p>
Personality	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- A person's character and temperament. A complex series of factors, unique to the individual.
Physical activity	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Any bodily movement produced by the contraction of the skeletal muscles that increases energy expenditure above a baseline level.
Physical Education	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- An integral part of total education process which has its aim the development of physically, mentally, emotionally fit citizen through the medium of physical activities which have been selected with a view of realizing these outcomes.
Physical Fitness	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- The capacity to perform physical activity with relative success and enjoyment without undue discomfort during or after. This normally involves a measure of the relative efficiency of the heart, blood vessels, lungs and muscles, in carrying out movements. In hard physical activity the enjoyment involves knowing that you have achieved your aims.
Physiology	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- The branch of biology that deals with the normal functions of living organisms and their parts. The way in which a living organism or bodily part functions.
Placement	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- The temporary posting of someone in a workplace to enable them to gain work experience.
Planning	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Planning is the formal process of making decisions for the future of individuals and organizations. Plans are statements of things to be done and the sequence and timing in which they should be done in order to achieve a given end.
Practice teaching	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Teaching done by student teachers for practicing teaching skills to improve teaching competencies.
Practicum	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Practical experiences by doing a project or conducting a survey in concerned subject/topics.
Recreation	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Activities generally done during an individual's leisure time (outside of school and work) and for non-competitive, non compensatory reasons.

Research	- Probes into what is known to reach the unknown; it is often the rigour of inquiry which is accomplished by objective pursuit of knowledge that is valued in research.
School community	- People belonging to community of a school – all the stakeholders of the school.
Self-appraisal	- Individual's/institutions own evaluation of his/ her/its performance.
Self-assessment	- Assessment of progress, attainment of objectives, etc by the actual learner, generally by using some sort of questionnaire or criterion-referenced test.
Seminar	- A small class, organized in order to discuss a particular topic or a conference of specialists in a particular field or a short, intensive course on a particular subject or topic.
Sport	- This term is used in many different ways. It could be described as 'a type of physical activity which you choose to compete in fairly, and try to win.' There have been many attempts to divide sport into different groups.
Sports Authority of India (SAI)	- An apex autonomous body of the Government of India under Union Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports Controlling sports development in the country through a variety of duly approved schemes.
Strategy	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- The intended or chosen plan to achieve a particular purpose.- A specific, medium or long-term plan for making progress towards a goal. A strategy should have the same attributes as a goal but should be more specific and action-oriented. Together a set of strategies, if successfully pursued, will impact the goal, measure and eventually achieve the goal
Student support	- Facilitating mechanism like guidance cell, placement cell, financial aid given to students etc. for encouraging and supporting his/her completion of the programme/ course.
Surplus Budget	- Surplus Budget is that budget when the current expenditure of the institution is less than the current income or revenues of the institution.

Syllabus	- Main heads and topics to be covered by a course of study or institution.
System	- The structure or organization of an orderly whole, clearly showing the interrelationship between the different parts (sub- systems) and between the parts and the whole.
Talent identification	- A process where ability is identified (generally by coaches or sport scientists) and athletes are measured against indicators of success and directed to a specific sport or sport skill. This process can occur before an individual starts participating in a sport, or while the individual is participating in a sport (and identified as having potential to reach the next level of competition or athlete development).
Team work	- The combined action of a group, especially when effective and efficient.
Techniques	- The basic patterns of movement which have to be developed in every activity.
Total Quality Management (TQM)	- Is a comprehensive approach for improving competitiveness, effectiveness and flexibility through planning, organizing and understanding each activity and involving each individual at each level.
Unit Cost	- Total annual recurring expenditure divided by the number of students enrolled.
Vision	- A vivid picture of an ambitious, desirable and future state. Its purpose is to inspire and act as a guide for decision-making and planning. It should be: Memorable; Involving; Aligned with institutional values; Linked to Students and stakeholders
Weightages	- Taking cognisance of the different types of relationship between the colleges and universities, each of the seven criteria has been given a differential weightage in order to distribute scores fairly without any handicap, incidental to a particular type of affiliation, affecting fair judgement.
